THE POSITION

The Shopper/Buyer works with the Technical Director in researching and procurement of materials required for the execution of the scenic design. This position delivers materials and equipment to locations as needed; maintains inventory of shop supplies and materials; coordinates maintenance of tools, equipment, and vehicles; maintains records of purchases and provides accounting statements. Compensation for this union position is \$26.82 per hour, full time, non-exempt (hourly).

Job Highlights

- Purchase materials as required by production demands and scene/paint shop needs
- Research materials to determine the best price and availability options
- Purchase materials and equipment to keep the shop functioning efficiently
- Drive various company vehicles as needed
- Maintain tool and material inventory system
- Prepare weekly and monthly budget statements
- Record material use on a weekly basis to ensure accuracy of reported stock levels
- Coordinate maintenance of shop and stage equipment
- Provide accounting documentation for scene shop budgets including tools, supplies and individual production scenic material accounts
- Other duties as needed or assigned

Qualifications

The Shopper/Buyer must embrace the Guthrie's commitment to Equity, Diversity and Inclusion. They will be an internal advocate for the scene shops' growth and development of equity, diversity and inclusion; modeling inclusive behavior; interrupting behaviors that hinder our diversity and inclusion efforts; demonstrating ability to foster respectful

A minimum of two years of related experience is required.
